

## Nature of Educational Research

Educational research refers to a systematic attempt to gain a better understanding of the educational process and, with a view to improving its efficiency. It is an application of scientific method to the study of educational problems.

Travers (1958) states -

Educational Research represents an activity directed towards the development of an organised body of scientific knowledge about the events with which educators are concerned. Of central importance are the behaviour patterns of pupils, and particularly those to be learned through the educational process. A scientific body of knowledge about education should enable the educators to determine just what teaching and other learning conditions to provide in order to produce desired aspects of learned behaviour among young people who attend school.

Since education is a behavioural science, the major concern of educational research is to understand, explain, and to some degree predict and control human behaviour. It is an activity directed towards the development of organized and useful body of scientific knowledge about the events with which educators are concerned.
